The Scottish Beekeepers' Association Period from 01 January 2015 to the 09 June 2015 Report of the Trustees

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and financial statements for the period ended 09 June 2015.

Status

This is the final period of account of the Scottish Beekeepers Association as an unincorporated association registered as a charity since 14 October 1942. As at 09 June 2015 all assets had been transferred to the Scottish Beekeepers' Association (SCIO) which has replaced it.

Structure

The activities of the Association are ultimately controlled by the Trustees, who meet regularly throughout the year

Trustee recruitment

Trustees are appointed, or reappointed, at the Annual General Meeting, held in March each year.

Objectives and activities

The organisation's purposes are to support honeybees and beekeepers, to improve the standard of beekeeping, and to promote honeybee products in Scotland through:

- The advancement of education in relation to the craft of beekeeping;
- The advancement of the heritage, culture and science of beekeeping; and
- The advancement of environmental protection by conservation of the honeybee. To promote beekeeping and encourage all interested in the art and science of beekeeping, stressing the benefits that beekeeping confers on agriculture and horticulture

Principal activities in the period

Change to SCIO

All assets have now been transferred to the SCIO and the SBA will continue operating as this new entity.

Promotion of Beekeeping and Shows.

The SBA continues to work towards increasing awareness of honey bees and beekeeping in Scotland. SBA presence at national and local horticultural, agricultural and honey shows, provides opportunities for public engagement. Continuing collaboration with Artlink has created more chances for their clients and beekeepers to work together to produce attractive and informative displays for use at shows. Communication with SBA members and the public continues through the SBA monthly magazine The Scottish Beekeeper, the SBA website, Facebook and the SBAi interactive discussion forum.

Education.

Continuing with the SBA aim of advancing education and improving the standard of beekeeping in Scotland, written modular examinations were held during the spring, and summer practical examinations have begun. Both are being taken by an increased number of candidates. Instructional day courses including, Microscopy, Wax preparation and Skep making were well attended. To promote bee health the SBA works with beekeepers and the Scottish Government and currently collaborates with the universities of Aberdeen and Dundee on research projects.

Meetings.

The SBA AGM was held in March. Three Trustees' meetings have been held with three more planned. Meetings continue with relevant bodies such as Scottish Government, Council of National Beekeeping Associations of the UK and Ireland (CONBA) and Food Standards Scotland.

Local Associations.

There are currently 45 Local Associations. At the SBA AGM, Local Associations, now called Affiliated Beekeeping Associations (ABAs), were granted complimentary SBA membership until 31 Dec 2015, while adjusting to their new status.

Reserves

The trustees have set a reserve fund of one and a quarter times the annual income.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the period ended 09 June 2015 which are set out on pages 6 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the accounts.
